INDIRECT QUESTION

INDIRECT QUESTIONS - RULES

- 1. USUALLY BEGIN WITH "COULD YOU TELL ME...?/DO YOU KNOW...?"
- 2. ONLY ONE QUESTION VERB FORM (Could you tell... / do you know...?) at the beginning of the sentence
- no question inversion
- no question auxiliaries (DO, DOES, DID), but keep the same grammar tense!
- 3. IN CASE OF NO QUESTION WORDS (where, how, etc.), USE "IF"
