

Conditional Sentences have two Clauses



CONDITIONAL CLAUSE - JAVATPOINT

CONDUCTIVE OFUSSE - SUAVELOUAL

If I have time, I'll prepare my presentation tomorrow.

- ×No, only the present form.





1ST / FIRST CONDITIONAL

×IF + PRESENT (SIMPLE / CONTINUOUS / PERFECT), **×FUTURE** (SIMPLE / MODAL VERB - can, must, may, might, should, etc.)

YOU CAN CHANGE THE ORDER

I'll prepare my presentation tomorrow
if I have time.



×IF + PAST (SIMPLE / CONTINUOUS), **×WOULD / MODAL VERB** - could, might

No, only the past perfect form.





×IF + PAST **PERFECT**(SIMPLE / CONTINUOUS), **×WOULD** (could, might) HAVE + III form/-ed

if I'd had time yesterday.
